2. 2nd Teams at A Level Events

- Objective: Make our premier events look as professional as possible. Level the playing field between teams with bigger/smaller rosters, and between those closer/further from A Level host sites.
- Proposal: No additional teams may be entered at fall A level events (still allowed at A-). *Host exception?*
- Reasons: Bring the early season A levels in line with the rest of the fall. Harry, Hatch, Hoyt will feel more like the Danmark, Capt. Hurst, ACCs. Deutsch, Regis, Mrs. Hurst will feel more like the Stu, Yale Women's, ACCs. There are many open berths at B level events for additional teams. This change would line up with the potential return of Open 2nd team berths at Regional events.

3. Late drop scheduling penalties

- Current: 12 point cushion, 8 points for late drop at 2-day event, 4 points at 1-day event. (1.5x for no show)
- Proposal: 12 point cushion, 8 points for late drop within 1 week, 4 points for late drop between 1 and 2 weeks. (1.5x for no show)
- Reasons: Change the severity of late drop penalties to scale with lateness, rather than length of the event in question. There is generally a large difference in difficulty caused to the host/scheduler between late drop within a week vs outside a week.
- Should there be consideration of the level of the event as well?*

4. NEISA Match Race Qualifying

- Current: 4 from Pine, 4 from Harman
- Proposal: 4 from Pine, 3 from Harman, 1 for Host
- Reasons: This reflects what we actually do, with one event losing a spot for the host. Acknowledges the difficulty difference between the events without unbalancing them.
- Should there be a host berth when the event is at a non-campus venue?*
