Co-ed NEISA PR Synopsis:

The system of top 4 regattas plus Schell created a fair ranking system of NEISA teams for the Fall 2021 season. No major tweaks or changes are recommended for Co-ed. As we do every year, we did receive feedback from coaches, which we thoroughly reviewed and analyzed. The four main areas of concern were:


- 1) do we even need the NEISA PR anymore? Doesn't the ICSA ranking system do this?
- 2) Relative appropriate weighting of sloop scores;
- 3) ACT relative weighting compared to the ACC and other regattas;
- 4) Inclusion of sloops and singles in the PR.

NEISA performance ranking vs. ICSA Competitive Strength Rank:


As this was the first year that the ICSA has adopted their own, independent competitive strength rank (CSR) system, we can make a direct comparison of the two systems. The two systems are remarkably similar in results, with the only differences stemming from NEISA's inclusion of sloop and singlehanded results and relative weighting and number of "keepers". All of this begs the question: is a separate NEISA ranking system still required? Are we aligning our conference in the best possible way for NEISA to continue to perform as well as possible on the national stage? What are NEISA's priorities for the PR vs CSR? Is the performance rank committee now just performing "busy work"? These are all valid considerations, however, the committee concluded to stay the course for now and allow for another year of data and comparison. As long as NEISA's top sailors are spending part of their competitive season pursuing singles and sloops, then there should be a way for those events to be counted. At the end of the spring season, we will have additional insight into how we fared as a conference in terms of gaining as many NEISA teams to their respective national championships as possible, and giving our conference the best chance at winning championships. The following tables and charts show how similar the ranking systems are:

In the opinion of the committee, it was felt that there was only a minor effect of sloops on scores and ranks. As the process of scheduling and each team's strategy to accrue points happens in real time, there is no way to simulate a scenario of "what would have happened if there were no sloop results", after the fact. As long as sloops remains a national championship at the ICSA level, the performance ranking committee recommends leaving sloop scoring opportunities as part of the available options.

ACT weighting vs ACC:

This is an ongoing topic of debate. It is important to consider that the ACT was given an "A-" level of ranking, because of its competitive relation to the Moody and the Hood. We still believe that to be the case and don't recommend changing that "A-" value. We considered a direct comparison of ACT to ACC, especially the seemingly valid argument of "a school in the ACT can't possible outscore a school that is competing in the ACC". However, the committee concluded that not all A-level events are equivalent in our system. For instance, the Hatch Brown is an A level event that is not as competitive as the Danmark. The committee concluded that there are some discrepancies that exist, but for the sake of keeping the scoring consistent

and simple, the ACT shall remain the weighting of the Hood and the Moody, just as all "A" level events shall remain equal (even though they are not).

Women's Performance Rank

Synopsis: With the increased participation levels of women's sailing over the last decade and the addition of women's team racing as a recognized ICSA discipline, the committee felt that further measures were needed to make the women's schedule and performance ranking even more similar to co-ed sailing and their ranking system. To that end, the Toni Deutsch regatta and the Regis regatta will be promoted to "A-level" status; in addition to carrying slightly more weight in the ranking system, the A-level status will also bring with it more suitable/appropriate rules regarding the addition of second teams.

ACT scoring: Due to the relatively high level of "b-level" of women's events compared to "a-level", an unintended consequence is that the ACT (which is scored as a b-level event) is, in the opinion of the committee, over-weighted -- the winner of the ACT is given the equivalent score as the 6th place finisher at the ACCs.

The committee acknowledges that the ACT to ACC comparison can create a little bit of an unfair comparison. The ACC is the most competitive regatta of the year; it is relatively underweighted compared to every other regatta. If you take a sample finish at another women's Alevel regatta and compare it to the equivalent finish at ACCs, it won't make much sense. The ACC is incredibly competitive and a good score is very difficult to achieve at that event. Having said that, we don't feel it appropriate to give women's ACC a higher value at this time.

We are proposing a new scoring table for women's ACT:

Women's NEISA Performance Rank vs. CSR:

A comparison of PR vs. CSR shows that the systems roughly produce the same ranking result. The biggest difference in NEISA ranking results from including singlehanded scores. A smaller difference results from weighting differences between the two.
